Dear Parents / Caregivers

Welcome to the 2023 school year! We hope you have all enjoyed the break. We are excited to be teaching Year 1 after teaching Year 2 for many years. We look forward to getting to know your child and seeing them progress throughout the year.

HOMEWORK

Homework will begin in week 3. This will give me time to get to know the students and introduce them to their new homework routine. It will be sent home on Friday and I ask that it is returned the following Thursday.

SWIMMING

Swimming will be commencing Thursday, week 2. For your child to be able to participate you must complete the permission form, prior to their lessons commencing. Swimming is part of the Physical Education curriculum and students are expected to participate. Students must have a towel, swimmers, a sun shirt and a cap (googles are optional) for their swimming lessons. Please label all belongings to assist with the return of lost items.

ASSEMBLY

The assembly has been split between the junior and senior school and will run every second week. The junior school assembly will be on every even week. Except for week 2 which will be a whole school assembly.

If your child will be missing school for any reason (ie holiday, appointments) please let us know so that I can adjust planning if necessary. If your child has an unexplained absence (eg sick, family emergency etc), please notify the office directly to avoid receiving a text message to explain the absence.

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Curriculum:

English	In this unit students will listen to, read and view a variety of poems to explore sound					
	patterns and features of plot, character and setting. Students will comprehend a poem,					
	create their own poem and recite a poem to the class.					
Maths	Students will represent and solve addition problems. They will order objects base					
	length and capacity using informal units. Students will recognise, model, write and					
	order numbers to 20, locate numbers on a number line and partition numbers using					
	place value. They will also classify outcomes of simple events.					
Science	Students will explore sources of light and sound. They will manipulate materials to					
	observe how light and sound are produced, and how changes can be made to light and					
	sound effects. Students will examine how light and sound are useful in everyday life					
	and respond to and ask questions. They will make predictions, share observations and					
	communicate their understandings in a variety of ways. Students will design and create					
	(at school) a musical instrument using recycled materials brought in from home. A					
	separate note will follow soon.					
HASS	In this unit students will explore the following inquiry question:					
	How has my family and daily life changed over time?					
Media Arts	In this unit, students will explore the existence and impact of sound as a representation					
	of settings and characters in the community.					
Health	In this unit, students recognise similarities and differences in individuals and groups,					
	and recognise how strengths and achievements contribute to identity. Students					
	identify and practise emotional responses that reflect their own and others' feelings.					
	They examine and demonstrate ways to include others in activities, and practise					
	strategies to help them and others feel that they belong.					

Below are some important details regarding your child's routine for Year One. Please read these carefully. If you have any questions regarding these, please do not hesitate to let me know.

MORNING ROUTINE REMINDER: Children are required to be lining up in two lines downstairs under the Year 1C sign each morning at the first school bell (8.45 am). Please assist your children with this where possible and ensure that your child has been to the toilet before the school bell if necessary.

AFTERNOON ROUTINE REMINDER: Children need to be collected downstairs or they may walk to the Drop Off/Pick Up Zone. Please ensure your child knows how they are going home in the afternoon, or if they are attending OSHC, to eliminate any confusion or anxiety at the end of the school day.



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LATE ARRIVALS/EARLY DEPARTURE: If your child arrives late or is leaving early, you will need to sign your child in/out at the office **BEFORE** you come to the classroom. <u>Please note: students CANNOT be released</u> without an early departure slip, even if there are only a few minutes left in the school day.

PARENT HELPERS: We love having parents help in the classroom! However, we have found that the children need time to settle in and find their place in the class, we will call for expressions once the class is settled. All volunteers MUST complete the Volunteer Induction (even if you have already previously done so) with a member of the Admin Team. Please contact the Office for more details and to book in!
