Dear Parents /Caregivers

Welcome back. I trust everyone is well rested after the holidays and ready for a flying start to the second half of the year.

As usual, homework is sent home with students on Thursday, with the due date the following Wednesday. I will however send the first lot home on Wednesday 13 July to get off to a good start. Like Term 2, it will consist of spelling words (to be written out three times), 3 sentences, multiplication tables and/or a similar relevant Maths task, and a problem-solving task. If, for any reason, homework can't be completed by the due date, an email or note from home would be greatly appreciated.

We have Health and Dance on Monday, Music and Japanese on Thursday, and Physical Education and Library on Wednesday. Students are required to transport their books to and from school and the library in a library bag. If your child does not currently have a library bag, could you please provide this (even just a plastic bag will work if you don't have a library bag).

This term students will be learning about the following:

English – students will complete a comprehension assessment and a written piece about the book Fantastic Mr Fox. For the writing task, students will take on the role of a character from the book and write a procedure that matches something this character would do.

Maths – students will be learning how to tell time to 5 and 1-minute intervals, how to add money and calculate change, different units of measurement to do with length, capacity and mass, and learn about patterns and problem solving.

Science – we will be exploring heat and how heat is transferred from one object to another. We will also learn about conductors and insulators of heat.

HASS – we will be learning about human and natural features of places, landmarks in Australia, school and community rules, and how to make democratic decisions.
