Curriculum Term Three

ENGLISH - Poetry

Students will read and listen to a range of humorous poems by different authors. They will identify structural features and poetic language devices in humorous poetry. They will use this knowledge to innovate on poems and evaluate the poems by expressing a personal viewpoint using evidence from the poem. They will then plan, create and present a humorous rhyming poem.

MATHS

There will be continued work with number and place culminating in the calculation of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division problems, whilst developing fluency with multiplication fact families.

Students will focus on fractions and decimals, in particular identifying, modelling and representing equivalent fractions; counting by fractions; and solving simple calculations involving fractions with like denominators.

There will also be a focus on measurement where students will use scaled instruments to measure temperature, capacity, area and length.

HASS - Using Places Sustainably

This term the students will examine the interconnections between people and environment and the importance of environments to animals and people. They will investigate how people use, and are influenced by, environments and how sustainability is perceived in different ways by different groups and involves careful use of resources and management of waste. There is a focus on identifying the purpose of structures in the local community, such as local government, and the services these structures provide for people and places.

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SCIENCE - Ready, Set, Grow!

In this unit students will investigate life cycles and sequence key stages in the life cycles of plants and animals. They will examine relationships between living things and their dependence on each other and on the environment.

TECHNOLOGY - What's your Waste Footprint?

Students will explore and manipulate different types of data and transform data into information. They will create a digital solution that presents data as meaningful information to address a school issue that will show how lunch waste can be reduced.

THE ARTS (Visual Arts) - Tiny Worlds

Students will experiment with visual conventions and visual language to create an imaginary environments inspired by real places by using mixed-media techniques, colour relationships and the application of materials.

Attendance

Allocating some time where your child can read out loud to you (and you read to them) is recommended on at least a weekly basis.
