Dear Parents /Caregivers

Welcome back to Term 4. This is the last term of school this year and as usual it will be busy with new units of work and assessments to complete. Following is a brief snapshot of what of what we will be studying this term.

ENGLISH

The unit will focus on creating a digital multimodal transformation of a narrative poem. We will transform the poem "fur and feathers" into a narrative which will include images and audio. Our class will continue with the Sound Waves spelling program and developing reading and writing skills.

MATHS

We will be looking at the following areas of maths.

- Calculate time and identifying factors multiples of twelve- and twenty-four-hour time.
- Describe chance and probability.
- Investigate with measurement and maps.

HASS

The aim of HASS is to ensure that students develop a sense of wonder, curiosity and respect about places, people, cultures and systems throughout the world, past and present. This subject includes history, Music and Dance this semester.

SCIENCE

In this unit students will investigate evaporations and explain solids, liquids and gases. They will plan, conduct and evaluate an investigation into a variable that affects evaporation and describe and apply knowledge of the physical properties of solids, liquids and gases.

HOMEWORK

Homework will continue to be sent home on Friday and MUST be returned on the following Friday of the next week. It has been wonderful to see a majority of students borrow regularly from our library and get into the habit of reading for pleasure. The more your child reads, the more words they will gain exposure to and they will inevitably make their way into your child's vocabulary and writing.
