

Geebung State School Uniform & Dress Standards





OUR SCHOOL UNIFORM

The Geebung State School community has developed a Student Dress Code that supports the wearing of a school uniform.

Our uniform helps provide a safe, supportive and inclusive learning environment by:

- Promoting a strong sense of school identity and pride
- Supporting consistent standards and expectations
- Making students easily identifiable
- Reducing individual discrimination and disadvantage
- Supporting safety and appropriate dress for school activities
- Reflecting the values and expectations of our school community
- Providing practical and long-term cost benefits for families

The Student Dress Code has been developed in consultation with the P&C Association, school staff and the wider Geebung State School community.

FORMAL UNIFORM

The formal uniform is worn for assemblies, school photographs, Anzac Day ceremonies, excursions, band performances and other formal school occasions.

Formal Dress

The formal dress features a green, black and white check with a reverse collar, sleeves, a zippered front and no defined waistline.

The dress should be worn at knee length or just above the knee.

Formal Shirt

The formal shirt features a green, black and white check, reverse collar, buttoned front and pocket detailing.

It is worn with black shorts, a skort or skirt.

Jacket or Jumper

Students may wear:

- A bottle-green polar fleece jumper or jacket with the embroidered school badge
- A plain bottle-green cardigan or jumper

Socks

Black or white short socks may be worn.

Shoes

Shoes should be predominantly black or predominantly white.

Winter Uniform

During winter, students may wear:

- Plain black tracksuit pants
- Full-length black leggings worn underneath a dress, skirt or skort

Leggings must not be worn on their own.



SPORTS UNIFORM

The sports uniform may be worn for regular school days, Physical Education and sporting activities.

Sports Shirt

A bottle-green and white polo shirt with the embroidered school badge.

Shorts, Skirt or Skort

Students may wear:

- Longer-cut black shorts
- A black skort
- A plain or pleated black skirt

Jacket or Jumper

Students may wear:

- A bottle-green polar fleece jumper or jacket with the embroidered school badge
- A plain bottle-green cardigan or jumper

Tracksuit Pants

Plain black tracksuit pants may be worn.

Socks

Black or white short socks may be worn.

Shoes

Shoes should be predominantly black or predominantly white.

All clothing and personal items must be clearly labelled with the student's name.

HATS AND SUN SAFETY

All students must wear a bucket hat when outdoors at school.

Caps are not permitted.

The wearing of an appropriate hat helps protect students from overexposure to the sun and is reinforced as part of the school's sun-safe practices.

Please clearly label your child's hat.

The school rule for outdoor activities is:

Have Hat, Can Play!

Students without an appropriate hat will be required to remain in a designated shaded area.



FOOTWEAR

The school uniform must be worn with safe and appropriate footwear.

Suitable footwear includes:

- Enclosed school shoes
- Runners
- Joggers
- Cross-trainers

Shoes should be predominantly black or predominantly white and worn with black or white laces.

Laced shoes are preferred; however, Velcro fastening is accepted and may be more suitable for younger students.

For health and safety reasons:

- Sandals are not recommended
- Thongs are not permitted
- Shoes must be worn in classrooms and throughout the school grounds

Appropriate footwear supports students during physical activity and provides protection for their feet and body.

The school rule for break-time activities is:

Have Shoes, Can Play!

SWIMWEAR

Students participating in swimming and other water-based school activities must wear a sun-safe swimming shirt or T-shirt.

Rash shirts form part of the primary school uniform requirements for water-based activities.

The school rule for swimming is:

Have Shirt, Can Swim!

YEAR 6 SENIOR SHIRTS

Year 6 students work together to select a special senior shirt to celebrate their final year of primary school.

The Year 6 shirt may be worn on regular school days, except Tuesdays when the formal uniform is required for assembly.

The senior shirt is not accepted as formal uniform for:

- School photographs
- Formal occasions
- Excursions
- Ceremonies
- Other official school activities



JEWELLERY

For safety and consistency, jewellery is limited to:

- One watch
- One pair of stud or sleeper earrings
- A religious symbol
- A medical alert bracelet

Other facial and body piercings are not permitted.

For safety reasons, earrings should not be worn during sporting activities.

Necklaces and bangles are not permitted.

HAIR, MAKE-UP AND NAIL POLISH

Students are expected to maintain a neat and appropriate appearance.

- Hair that is shoulder length or longer must be tied back for health and safety reasons
- Hair should remain one natural colour
- Hair accessories should be minimal and in school colours
- Make-up is not permitted
- Nail polish is not permitted

BICYCLE HELMETS

Students riding bicycles are legally required to wear an approved helmet.

Helmets must be securely fastened at all times.

Not wearing a helmet is against the law and may place the student and others at risk.

INAPPROPRIATE DRESS

Inappropriate dress includes clothing or accessories that may be:

- Offensive
- Unsafe for the student or others
- Likely to disrupt the normal operation of the school
- Likely to negatively influence the school environment
- Likely to create a health or safety risk
- Inconsistent with the school's uniform expectations

Items that are not considered part of the school uniform include:

- Jeans
- Cargo pants
- Multicoloured jackets
- Streetwear
- Baseball caps
- Singlet tops
- Sleeveless shirts
- Bike pants or leggings worn on their own



- Jackets or jumpers with hoods

Bike pants and leggings may be worn underneath a skirt or dress.

UNIFORM SHOP

The Geebung State School Uniform Shop is the official stockist of the school uniform and also offers a selection of second-hand items.

The Uniform Shop is operated by the P&C Association and is located under A Block.

LOST PROPERTY

Lost property is located under A Block near the P&C Office.

Families are welcome to check the lost property racks and containers at any time.

At the end of each term, unlabelled uniform items may be washed and transferred to the second-hand uniform collection.

Clearly labelling every item with your child's name makes it easier for belongings to be returned.

SUPPORTING OUR DRESS STANDARDS

The Geebung State School community supports the wearing of the school uniform each day.

Families are asked to ensure students arrive at school wearing the correct uniform and suitable footwear.

The Student Dress Code is reviewed annually in consultation with school staff and the P&C Association.
